Facilities


After undertaking an extensive search for our 'forever home', Central Film School moved to its current campus in 2022. Occupying a former 19th-century music hall nestled between Brixton and Clapham North, our premises provide students with everything they need to bring their stories to life.


Boasting an expansive area of 15,500 square feet, our campus offers an impressive array of amenities, carefully designed to cater to the needs of our students and wider academic community.

These include:

- Two ample studio spaces
- Screening facilities with seating for 90+ students
- Virtual production wall
- Kit and prop rooms
- Edit suite
- Dedicated post-production zone
- Student common room
- Library / study space
- Bright and functional teaching spaces















Kit & Equipment

At Central Film School, we understand the importance of our academic community having access to industry-standard equipment.

Our students benefit from the School's £1 million pound capital grant from the Office for Students, funding major investment in our kit, equipment and production technology.

We have a range of cameras for our students to use depending on their needs and expertise. Starting with the BlackMagic 6K Cinema Camera, students progress to advanced cameras like the BlackMagic Ursa 12K Cinema Camera, and the Arri ALEXA - BA Practical Filmmaking students have the opportunity to use the ARRI SRIII Super 16mm. We offer comprehensive training on a range of sound and lighting kits, fostering cohesive crew operation throughout productions.

Studio B features full Motion Capture technology, while Studio A now offers cutting-edge Virtual Production Facilities, enabling students to expand their stories into the virtual world.

Our post-production facilities were fully upgraded in 2023 to meet the latest industry standards. The Edit Suite now houses 20 Mac Mini M2 systems with dual-screen monitors, accessible to all students.

The wider post-production zone includes:

- Hero Suite
- Colour Grading Zone
- Animation Booth
- Additional Dialogue Recording and Mixing Studio













Life in London

Studying film in London is a perfect fit for those looking for endless opportunities to learn and grow, as well as work within the film sector. London remains the centre of the screen industries in the UK, with studios such as Pinewood, Warner Bros. Studio Leavesden, and Shepperton, each expanding their facilities to accommodate the ongoing explosion of film and television production in the country. The creative economy is estimated to provide one in six jobs in London, and the creative industries generate around £42 billion for the UK economy.

London retains a position as one of the top-choice destinations for students. Central Film School's prime location means that our students get to experience exceptional dining, lush parks, and diverse entertainment offerings. All within close proximity, attractions such as the Ritzy Cinema, Tate Modern on the South Bank, Clapham Common, and Peckham Levels are ready to be explored. Traveling to Central London is quick and convenient, with tube, overground, and bus connections all within a few minutes walk of the school. Soho, Shoreditch, and Oxford Circus can all be reached by public transport in approximately 20 minutes.





The three-year pathway allows you to:

- Discover your strengths by exploring a range of disciplines before specialising in your chosen field.
- Build your creative skillset with practical, on-set experience and industry-informed teaching.
- Prepare for success with a structured and supportive transition into degree-level study.
- Access your degree with confidence even if you don't currently meet standard entry requirements.

You will learn:

Through key modules such as Foundation in Screen Practice, you'll gain hands-on experience using filmmaking equipment and creating short films; Screen Industries Research, which strengthens your research and study skills; Writing Short Scripts, focusing on storytelling, character, and genre; and Professional Practice, covering the full production process alongside vital organisational skills.

Your first year concludes with a **Final Group Project**, where you'll collaborate to shoot your own short film. This practical experience prepares you for real-world filmmaking, helping you build a strong creative and professional foundation.






Language Requirements

The Global Lens Scholarship is designed to recognise and support outstanding international talent, offering two full scholarships that cover 100% of tuition fees for the first and, where applicable, second year of postgraduate study.

Open to students from outside the UK and Ireland, the scholarship celebrates creative storytelling with global impact and aims to empower emerging filmmakers who are committed to contributing to the screen industries in their home countries. The two-stage application process includes a video submission and, for short listed candidates, a creative project proposal.

Access & Equity Scholarship

Central Film School's Access & Equity Scholarship supports students from under-represented or disadvantaged backgrounds in the UK and Ireland, offering two full undergraduate scholarships that cover tuition fees for the first and second year of study.

The scholarship is open to applicants who meet specific criteria related to financial, social, or personal challenges. Candidates apply through a two-stage process, beginning with a short self-tape reflecting on their personal journey and aspirations, followed by a creative proposal for short listed applicants.
